#### 1990

AGCO was formed in the management buyout of Deutz-Allis from KHD and began manufacturing and distributing farm equipment under the AGCO® Allis and Gleaner® brand names

#### 1992

AGCO provided an initial public offering of one-half of its stock and became listed on NASDAQ. Subsequently, it became listed on the NYSE under the symbol "AG" in 1994

#### 1994

AGCO acquired Massey Ferguson

#### 1997

AGCO acquired Fendt Gmbh

#### 1999

AGCO announced the creation of AGCO FINANCE, a new and dedicated financing organization

#### 2000

AGCO completed the purchase of Hay and Forage Industries in Hesston, Kansas

#### 2004

Valtra was acquired by AGCO

#### 2008

SISU Diesel was rebranded AGCO SISU POWER

#### 2009

AGCO announced plans to open two manufacturing sites in China

#### 2011

In March AGCO acquired 100% of Laverda S.p.A after the 2007 joint venture

GSI Holding Corp. (GSI), a leading global manufacturer of grain storage and protein production systems, was acquired by AGCO in late 2011

#### 2014

AGCO acquired the total of Santal Equipamentos

#### 2016

AGCO acquired Cimbria Holdings Limited, a leading global manufacturer of equipment used for seed processing and post-harvest grain handling

AGCO agreed a partnership with Aglytix and Farmobile

#### 2017

AGCO completed the acquisition of the Forage Division of Lely Group, a leading manufacturer of balers and loader wagons in Europe, to further strengthen AGCO's full line product offering.

#### 2018




